Develop with local community

In order to bring up the people who preserve the monuments and supporting the local community, JST established a new junior high at the new area and started to school management.

Increasing advancement rate at local community

Until now, there is no junior high school in Angkor Krau Area and the education continuance rate of a junior high school is less than 15%. The children at local community wanted to get compulsory education. However they couldn't because of under their environment.

In this situation, there were strong requests from local community to construct a junior high school. JST offered land of school and Japanese supporter offered The Classroom Establishment Funds, also. Finally, we could established Bayon Junior High School in October 2013.

This first year, 135 students, who had graduated from elementary school at located on neighboring villages, could enter the Bayon junior high school. And now, they are studying everyday forward to their bright future.

Superintendent of schools in Siem Reap inspected field of education in Japan

JST helps to expand the wave of cultural exchanging "Japan to Cambodia" "Cambodia to Japan". In 2013, the superintendent of education in Siem Reap province and the head of teacher training school inspected field of education in Japan. In addition, the member of Japanese local government visited officially the governor in Seim Reap.

Also, we accepted many Japanese study tour students, exchanging field experience of restoring monuments and played with Angkor Krau children. Through these exchanging cultures, Krau youth group has been grown as a supporting Angkor Krau Village and connect with between Angkor Krau Village and world outside.

Offer special classes of Region-Based and give opportunities to broaden their world to children

At the Bayon Junior high school offered not only general classes but also special classes more than once a month. The school have invited specialists of restoration of the monuments, archaeologists, folklorists, researchers of fresh water fish and managements of the NGO so far.

These are more practical classes than general classes, besides students took classes with a great deal of interest. It will spread children's dreams for sure.



I Japanese University students show great activity as intern students

JST ties up with Kwansei Gakuin University and has accepted volunteer students since April 2013. The students do not only support JST activities, but also dig into their topic and write on a report or start up one project with each topic.

It is pretty usuful time for both of the students and JST.

"Illustrated book of Restoration" by JST, adopted as an education material

JASA's restoration activities marks 20th Anniversary this years. To hand down the experience of restoration activities at Bayon and Angkor Wat, JST made "illustrated book of Restoring" for Cambodian children.

We invited Cambodian restoration specialists to Bayon junior high school and taught ancient building techniques and how to restore monuments, based on the picture book. Children get interested in monuments is the first step for the future.

JST has guided restoration site, home stay in Angkor Krau Village and culturing exchanging between Krau youth group and children. Like this, we offer a tour that is somthing different from others tours. Tour revenue is used for the school in local villages or project of restoring monuments, also it brings the village and the children better educational environment and life little by little.
