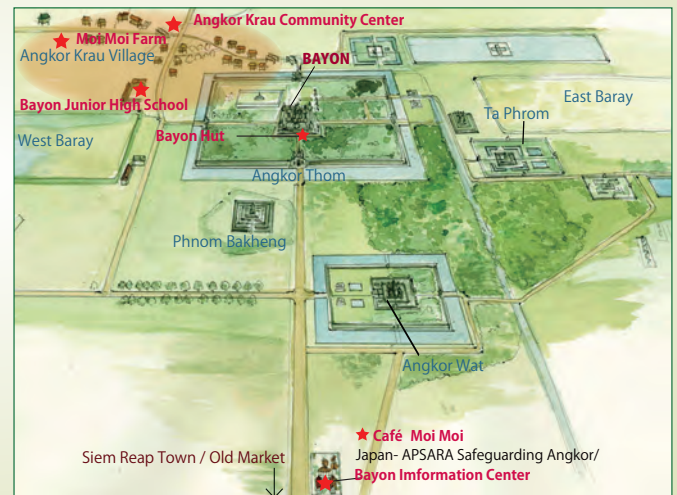


JST is supporting People living with Heritage.

2016 Activity Report



Joint Support Team for Angkor Community Development

For three years we have been walking with Bayon Junior High School and from now on.



The year of 2015 is the special year for us JST.

- October, 2015 the construction of the school finished including 16 classrooms, 5 teachers' dormitories, toilets, storage room, and kitchen.
- On 1st November, the third opening school ceremony took place, when as many as 460 students from grades 7 to 9 gathered together.
- On 16th January 2016, official opening ceremony was held in the school. A lot of supporters from Japan, America and students' parents participated.
- On 17th January, First sports festival(Undoukai) was held. A lot of participators from the areas joined and enjoyed.

Before we established the Bayon junior high school, the advancement rate to secondary school was less than 15 %, but after we built Bayon Junior high school, the percentage reached at almost 100%. Now childrens' dreams of studying at secondary school have been true.

But in this area also still has serious problems of education system.

1. Primary school students from these 5 areas face with the issues of grade retention and school dropout (see right)
2. There were 18 students who had to give up school due to working in the Bayon junior high school.
3. There is no high school in that area.
4. When the number of elementary school-leavers improve and all students proceed to the secondary school, it will encounter a new problem, lack of classrooms.(see right: according to the number of 1st grade students, the number of students who will study in the school will be predicted more than 1000.)
5. The school has to find other ways to gain financial resources to operate it because of short of state subsidy.
6. The teacher's salary from the government is insufficient. ※ JST pays commutation allowance.

Presently, almost all of the students at Bayon Junior high school aim to proceed to a high school. We will continue supporting them in order to let their dreams realized. Increasingly shining their lights of hope, that is our next mission.

Restoration Project of NAGA and SINGHA images at BAYON Temple

Restoration work has finished at Eastern Causeway of Bayon temple

In this project, which started in 2012, we have been restoring Naga and Singha images and balustrade from east facade to south of the outer gallery of Bayon temple.

Once these areas were restored by French team. However, most were broken again and under serious situation. Now, we could ensure the safety of tourists and contribute to the improvement of the landscape by giving appropriate treatment to each elements, and reconstruction towards a stable condition.

Also, human resource development from Cambodian to Cambodian are progressing concurrently. 7 members of this project are receiving on-site training from JASA (Japan APSARA Safeguarding Angkor) experts and technical staffs who have skills and experience in restoration work, research and survey for about 20 years and achieve good results from their effort.

From April 2016, we started 3rd phase of this project!

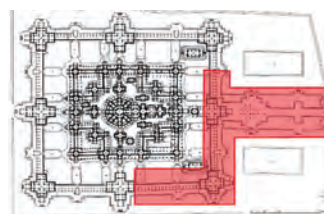
